Madame Chair,

My focal topic is Faith which is one of the nine gifts of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:7-11) and, one of the three theological virtues. Biblically, faith is described as the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of unseen realities, (Hebrews 11:1), embodying unshakable trust in God's promises, no matter what.

As Catholics, our faith is embedded in the Nicene and the Apostles' Creeds. Pope Francis' vision of the church is one of "inclusivity, doctrinal progression and Synod; a synodal church for communion, participation and mission; while listening and being more responsive to the needs of its faithful." In my role as Christian Family Life Chair, I raised awareness on societal issues, including but not limited to medical assistance in dying (MAiD), and advocating for Horizons of Hope and palliative care as alternatives.

I have highlighted resources from the Office for Evangelization & Catechesis of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) regarding webinars on Vatican II, in preparation for Jubilee 2025, and aimed at inviting the faithful to reflect on the life of the church today.

I contributed to the collection of Spiritual Bouquet for the 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Ordinandi Dinner, appreciatively received by eight Ordinandi. Members and parish communities committed generously with spiritual and devotional offerings.

Members were encouraged to pray for the sanctity of life, marriage and family, seniors, youth, widowed, separated and divorced, disabled, singles, and religious vocations with respect to human dignity as a right.

Echoing the League's Mission Statement, "The Catholic Women's League of Canada calls its members to grow in faith and witness to the love of God through ministry and service", it is evident that CWL members are "Called to Serve". Faith without works is dead (James 2:14-26). Faith in God demands action to support our
