Unity Outreach

In 2023, TDC executive members visited parish councils and delivered the Unity Outreach program initiated by national. These sessions were very positive, as councils recollected all the wonderful works they have done and continue to do for their parish, their community and beyond. The councils also had the opportunity to express how the league at all levels could assist them and what made them proud to be a member. Three of the take-aways that stood out for me are: the need for TDC executive to be present at council general meetings/events; the importance of honour guards and streamlining correspondence from all levels of the league.

At our first TDC executive meeting of the 2024-2026 executive in June, I brought forward your request for our presence at the council level and the executive, unanimously and enthusiastically agreed that they would love to attend council general meetings/events. It was heartwarming to hear of the honour and pride the members expressed serving in an honour guard for their council members. The honour guard is a way for members to say "thank you" to deceased members who have given so much to the league. Please do not feel the need to limit the number of members in an honour guard, and if you need help with an honour guard, reach out to other councils for assistance, as league members have had an impact outside their council as well.

Correspondence

This take-away was a concern from all councils - the need to reduce the number of emails from all levels. In answer to this concern, correspondence was streamlined so that national sends directives on Wednesdays; provincial, who was sending directives on Fridays, has now confirmed that they will not send out emails, rather, they will correspond through their monthly newsletter, which can be accessed on their webpage and Toronto diocese will send out their correspondence on Mondays. National and Toronto diocese send their correspondence directly to council presidents.

Council presidents, when you receive the correspondence, you are to ensure it is forwarded right away, to all your council members. A plan needs to be put into place as to how you will make sure all members receive the correspondence: email, hard copy to be picked up by member at parish office or after church, Canada post or phone tree.

Toronto Diocesan Council 103rd Annual Convention

The convention centred on the National theme, *Here I am Lord; Send me*, Isaiah 6:8, with the first day focusing on *Here I am Lord* and the second day, *Send me*. A total of 390 members were in attendance over the two days. Opening Mass was celebrated by Rev. Fr. Liborio Amaral, along with regional and parish spiritual advisors. National President, Shari Guinta, brought greetings on behalf of national and Colleen Martin, President Elect, brought greetings from provincial. Kathleen Ancker, the Keynote Speaker on Monday evening after the Youth Awards, related her experience with the Catholic Women's Leadership Foundation as part of her lifelong learning experience.

One resolution was passed, and Diocesan Chairperson of Social Justice, Christina Boyle has the update on this resolution in her report.

Our newest council, Swahili Catholic Community CWL was gifted with Our Lady of Good Counsel icon. Our Tuesday, Keynote Speaker was Fr. Eugene O'Reilly, C.Ss.R., who spoke to us in answering the call, *Send me*. Keynote

speaker for the Tuesday banquet was the Most Rev. John Boissonneau, Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto.

Closing Mass was celebrated by the Most Rev. Ivan Camilleri, Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto and Rev. Fr. Liborio and spiritual advisors in attendance were concelebrants.

Congratulations to Sue Lubowitz, Past President and the 2024 convention committee, Mary Hawkley, Mary Ellen Stinson and Lynette Mendes for a well run convention.

Opening and closing Masses were celebrated by Most Rev. Thomas Dowd, Bishop of Sault Ste. Marie Diocese and Provincial Spiritual Advisor, and diocesan and council spiritual advisors were concelebrants. Congratulations to Hilarion Mitchell, outgoing past president who was recognized as a new Life Member.

National President, Shari Guinta did a presentation on how she came to the national theme, *Here I am Lord; Send me*, and how, as a national executive, they came to a consensus to have mental health as the focus. Each parish

council is encouraged to personalize this focus on the needs of their community.

A beautiful sunrise prayer service was celebrated at the Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Keynote Speaker was Edwina MacDonald, on *Listening to Indigenous Voices*. Edwina and her team presented Session 3 from this book, *The Land is Us*.

At the closing Mass, a new provincial slate of officers was installed. Equally important is maintaining our existing members by keeping them engaged. Each of us has a responsibility to share your joy and love of the league. Reach out to the women in your parish and invite them to join the league: through personal invitation, being visible in the parish and community and sharing the work that is being done through the league, reaching out to the vulnerable and marginalized through our projects and resolutions. Appreciate current members and let them know that they are a valuable part of your council. Reach out to members who have not renewed their membership. Let them know they are missed and welcome them back. Each parish is unique, look for ways that work best in your council that will instill more member engagement.

Parish councils will continue with the current theme "Here I am Lord, send me" until the end of 2025. You should now be following the new organizational structure, but the role of the past president has not changed with the structure changes.

The Past President/Historian Duties

The *Handbook for Past Presidents* has a great deal of information worth reading. Part XII, Section 6 of the *Constitution and Bylaws* and the information provided in the *National Manual of Policy and Procedure* will be of great help to you.

The first stated duty of the past president is to serve her council and president in a consultative capacity. Future newsletter articles as well as Monday Correspondence will go into more depth on specific duties. In the interim, do not hesitate to reach out to me should you have any questions. If you feel you require assistance in this role, please know that having another member or subcommittee join you, is perfectly fine and is advisable.

With 2024 drawing to a close, a couple of items need to be addressed and are detailed in the *National Manual of Policy and Procedure* (P&P).

- Send proposed revisions (form 551) to the P&P, to national office by December 1. All past presidents are encouraged to monitor/review the P&P and invite members to do the same.
- Council manuals of policy and procedure should be reviewed biannually. Starting now, would allow for the time needed to

accomplish the required approvals. A workshop will be offered in January 2025.

Past presidents at all levels are encouraged to write a two or three page summary of highlights during their term as president. Take your time with this activity as you review past notes, meetings and photographs recounting the wonderful memories of your meetings, travels and special times with members. Submit photographs, clippings, etc., to augment these events.

Under the new structure, one key word became very evident to me as I was delving



into my role as secretary, and that word is communication. Communication is the common denominator. And most importantly, 'two-way communication'. Two-way communication is defined as when one person, the sender, transfers a message to another person, the receiver. When the receiver gets the message, they send back their response. This lets the sender know that the information was received. ANNUAL REPORTS



Development and Peace:

Women Changing the World: The 1% Program

Development and Peace - Caritas Canada, the official international development organization of the Catholic Church in Canada, in partnership with CWL, accomplished impressive milestones for the 2022-2023 period.

Since 1969, the league has been encouraging its members to contribute to the 1% National Voluntary Fund by putting aside 1% of the cost of all personal items they purchase and of funds raised by councils, to support Development and Peace and its partners. These partners work to improve the status of women in the Global South, and collectively, the funds are having a real impact on the lives of thousands of women striving for a better future.

The League is supporting projects in Afghanistan, the Sahel and the Democratic Republic of The Congo. For example, in rural areas of Afghanistan, many children, especially girls, do not go to school because of the vast distance to the nearest school. Development and Peace is partnering with Catholic Relief Services on a community-based schools project to bring education to these remote communities. Through partnership with organizations in the Global South, Development and Peace is deeply rooted in the values of the Gospel, particularly the preferential option for the poor. (Faith Anderson, National Chairperson of Community Life, 2022)

Project 1: Food and Nutritional Security; Climate Change - Sahel Project (SANC2S)

Country: Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger

This is a five year project, running from 2021 to 2026

Update: Burkina Faso - Reforestation and village forest management: 40 hectares of deteriorate forest have been regenerated and enhanced, and focus continues on implementing communities' capacity to maintain and protect their forests through reforestation efforts.

Niger - Restoration of degraded lands: 120 hectares of pastoral lands were rehabilitated and redeveloped which will help improve the food and nutritional security of many Niger families who subsist on pastoralism.

Northern Mali - Stabilizing Dunes: Steps to stabilization of dunes has provided vital protection against advancing deserts and protection from silting of the banks of the River Niger. Participation by women, men and young people, working together, has strengthened the communities' resilience against climate change with a focus on conserving and preserving natural resources, allowing for continued production of varied and nutritious vegetables to feed families.

Project 2: Inclusive governance project for Kasenga women through functional literacy

Country: Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC)

This was a 34 months program, which ran from March 2021 to December 2023.

Update: In 2023 alone, 165 women were trained in functional literacy programs. The project focused on literacy programs which helped women learn new skills in agriculture or other income-generating activities. The program enabled women to read, write and calculate, along with garnering status for themselves in their communities. Participating women also gained access to information regarding health, environmental protection, human rights and specifically the rights women have in a political arena.

National Indigenous Peoples Day

National Indigenous Peoples Day was the theme for the first CWL Wednesday, for the new TDC Executive. Our session on June 19, provided an opportunity to learn how Indigenous peoples view their connection to the

land and how that sacredness towards the earth and all living things informs their way of thinking and their belief system.

Rosella Kinoshameg, Wikwemikong, First Nation, was the keynote speaker. The breakout room session provided members the opportunity to look at the wording of our Land Acknowledgement and to consider ways to make it more meaningful. An excellent resource is *Listening to Indigenous Voices*, *A Dialogue Guide on Justice and Right Relationships*, by the Jesuit Forum for Social Faith and Justice. National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

September 30 is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. It is also Orange Shirt Day. Toronto Diocesan Executive requested this day be recognized at the parish council or regional level.

When we meet again in November, please share details of any events you organized to recognize this very important day.

Resolutions

Ontario Provincial CWL Convention was held in Sudbury on July 7 to 10, 2024. One resolution from the Toronto Diocese was adopted at the convention, **ON.24.02** *National School Food Program for All*, and it was sent to National to be reviewed. I want to thank the originating parish council St. John Fisher, Brampton, Peel Region, for all the hard work involved in research, composition and presentation of the resolution. Whether a resolution is adopted or not, the work involved to raise an issue, research, study and compose it, gives each member a voice. Resolutions are the League's voice with government, and members' voices are the League's voice. That means each member, as part of the whole, can make a difference! (www.cwl.ca Resources / Manuals: Resolutions Handbook # 618)

October 31, 2024 is the deadline date for a parish council to submit an idea for a resolution. The steps on how to get started are outlined on the TDC website www.cwltoronto.ca Resources / Resolutions.

Another topic brought to the forefront was Sex Trafficking, including the nine Warning Signs (Covenant House) and how to fight the problem through education. Prevention is so much easier than trying to rescue a trafficked individual. Help is available at The Joy Smith Foundation, the Mary Ward Centre, and the Canadian Human Trafficking hotline (1-833-900-1010). The IWIN (I'm Worth it Now) organization provides backpacks to those escaping being trafficked. Along with essential items, the backup also includes a bracelet that is matched with a CWL prayer warrior. The IWIN program could

fall under all three pillars of Faith, Service and Social Justice. More information about the program will be presented in the future.

Legislation Update

Bill S-210: An Act to restrict young persons' online access to sexually explicit material.

This Federal Bill seeks to protect youth from access to explicit materials online. This Bill has passed all three readings in the Senate, and First and Second Reading in the House of Commons. The committee stage was completed on June 7, 2024 but to date, there is no activity in the Report Stage and the Bill still has to reach Third Reading in the House. This is such an important piece of legislation, that Archbishop Francis Leo wrote (on June 12, 2024) to Members of Parliament in ridings within the Archdiocese of Toronto encouraging MPs to support the Bill. His full letter is on www.archtoronto.org

You can also support this bill through letter writing to your local MP and reinforce the support shown by Archbishop Leo.

Bill C-322: An Act to develop a national framework to establish a school food program.

This is a Private Member's Bill sponsored by Serge Cormier (Acadie-Bathurst, New Brunswick). It is currently in the Report Stage in the House of Commons. We need to monitor this Bill to ensure it is implemented in a sustainable way, and the funds that were earmarked for it during the 2024 Federal budget are used to develop such a program. The TDC submitted a Resolution on this topic at the Ontario Provincial Convention, where it was accepted and sent to National for consideration. Because **Bill C-322** is currently before the House of Commons, the Resolution will not be taken up at the National Convention. Our follow up action should be to spread awareness of the Bill and the need for such a program, and write letters in support, to both federal and provincial governments.
